MESSAGE FROM

THE PRESIDENT

Greetings Friends, the Friends had another successful year supporting the National Park Service here at Flight 93 National Memorial. I believe this year can be summed up as one of refreshing and enhancing old ideas and bringing new innovative ideas to life.

Refreshing old ideas included a celebration during National Park Week, Volunteer Week and Earth Day. Friends invited 10-year reforestation partners to share in a day of service followed by a lunch reception. Volunteers shared stories of their involvement over the years. Reforestation will be refreshed and in 2024 will become a volunteer "Day of Caring" for the environment.

On-site educational learning was enhanced with the creation of an Educational Scholarship. This scholarship replaces the transportation grant and offers more opportunities for tier one schools with students in grades 4-12 to visit the memorial. Scholarships are funded through EITC donations, the Grable Foundation and donors who chose to support education. In 2023, over 10,000 students took part in an on-site learning experience.

Walk 93 transitioned to Heroes Walk in 2022 and continues to be a success with the enhanced feature of family members walking with participants and sharing stories of their loved ones. Family members supporting this year's walk were Debby Borza, Gordie Felt, Patrick White and Barbara Williams. We are grateful to these family members for sharing their stories. The funds raised in 2023 will go toward the care and maintenance of Memorial Groves.

The completion of the Western Overlook enhancements was one more way in which Friends partnered with the National Park Service and the Army National Guard from the 333 Battalion in Reading, Pa. The enhancements provide an area where visitors can learn about the historical significance of this part of the Memorial. During the fall months Park Rangers offered walking tours entitled "13 days". This program was well received.

Refreshing our tourism strategy to include advertising in the metro areas of Washington DC and Virginia was one more way Friends promoted visitation. This and advertisements in the Garett County Parks Guide continue to increase awareness of the Memorial and its features. While adding these new marketing sources, Friends continue to use billboards and partnerships with surrounding tourism agencies.

New partnerships emerged as Friends and family members worked with organizations like the Gary Sinise Foundation and Project 957. This collaboration resulted in the development of a youth leadership program focused on the lessons learned from the Flight 93 story. Family members David Beamer, Gordie Felt and Ken Nacke spent three days with this youth group talking about the events of 9/11 and the impact these events had on our country. The leadership program was an excellent way for Friends to expand their reach to new students. Debby Borza also partnered with Project 957 as a facilitator for a three-day leadership camp. The camp concluded with Debby taking participants on a tour of the Memorial. Thank you, family members, for helping us reach a new generation.

The National Day of Learning "Teach to Remember" was a new idea brought to life in 2023. With a goal of reaching students globally and offering educators resources to teach about the events of 9/11, Friends and National Park Service collaborated to make this program available to the public. Virtual tours of the Memorial features, interviews with family members, a pre-recorded moment of remembrance as well as live stream observance ceremony were just a few of the elements offered via a Zoom events platform. When registering for the event, educators received links to resources that would enhance their students' learning experience. Park rangers were available during the afternoon of 9/11 to answer questions from students.

2023 GIVING TUESDAY

Friends raised almost \$70,000 to support on-site education field trips.

Field trip season for students in grades 4-12 began in April and ran through the end of October.

Friends and National Park Service hosted over 10,000 students annually.

A PIVOT FOR 9/11

The National Park Service and the Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial anounced 'Teach to Remember,' a virtual education program as part of the evolving 9/11 ceremony at Flight 93 National Memorial. Educators registered for the virtual event starting in August 2023. On Monday, September 11, 2023, the park virtually welcomed schools and students from across the United States to join the reading of names and moment of silence.

"Every year the memorial recognizes September 11 as a day of remembrance and a time to pay respect," said Flight 93 National Memorial Superintendent Stephen M. Clark. "It also provides an opportunity for teaching younger generations about the events of that day."

"I am grateful to the National Park Service and Friends of Flight 93 for adapting the annual September 11 Observance to reach classrooms while still remembering our loved ones. Teach to Remember welcomes students to connect with 9/11 in their own way," said Emily Schenkel, niece of Flight Attendant Lorraine G. Bay and Board of School Director for the Bethlehem Area School District.

The virtual learning event kicked off early on the morning of September 11 and featured several classroom sessions throughout the day for grades 6-12.

WRITE TO REMEMBER 9/11

During the late summer months Friends collaborated with the National Park Service and the National Writing Project to launch Write to Remember 9/11. This project inspired students to participate in the National Day of Learning and then write about lessons learned that could assist them in solving some of the problems they face today.

THE LAUCH OF NATIONAL DAY OF LEARNING (NDL)

The day finally arrived to launch the National Day of Learning - Teach to Remember 9/11.

The morning started with a press conference where Adam Shaffer, chief of interpretive and visitor services and Donna Gibson, Friends Executive Director spoke to the press about the new initiative and why it is so important for educators to have the resources to instruct their students on the events of 9/11.

The program was held virtually and had over 500 schools from 40 states and over 22,000 students participate in part or all the available programming.

Sponsors were provided with the opportunity to advertise on the zoom platform during the launch of the National Day of Learning.



WESTERN OVERLOOK DEDICATION CEREMONY

At the end of the 2023 Heroes' Walk, Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial hosted a dedication and ribbon cutting ceremony for the newly enhanced Western Overlook at Flight 93 National Memorial.

Through various fundraising efforts in 2022, Friends and family members raised funds to support this project.

Army National Guard from the 333 Battalion from Reading, PA offered engineering and construction services to help support the project completion.

The Western Overlook is the space where families had their first view of the crash site in September 2001, first responders offered aid to family members and the crime scene investigation of Flight 93 would unfold.

Park rangers have developed a new interpretive program, '13 Days in September'. This is a walking tour offered to interpret the historical significance of this site.

Representatives from Families, National Park Service and Friends cut the ribbon and spoke during the dedication, while walk participants were the "First View" of the enhanced space. Pennsylvania Mountain Service Corps AmeriCorps volunteers provided flowers to walkers to leave behind in honor and memory of the 40 passenger and crew members.






FINANCIAL STEWARDSHIP

VISITOR SPENDING IN 2022

In 2022, 347 thousand park visitors spent an estimated \$22.9 million in local gateway communities while visiting Flight 93 National Memorial.

These expenditures supported a total of 328 jobs, \$12.2 million in labor income, \$19.0 million in value added, and \$33.6 million in economic output in local gateway economies surrounding Flight 93 National Memorial.
