A MESSAGE FROM DONNA GIBSON, PRESIDENT OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Dear Friends,

The first year as your President has been quite exciting for me as this was a year of transition. The completion of the Tower of Voices means that the National Park Foundation will transition its fundraising efforts to the Friends. As of the end of this year, we will have primary responsibility for donor development and the direct mail campaign, which will support ongoing projects, programs and personnel. Although the National Park Foundation will no longer drive these activities, it will continue as a strategic partner and assist us in achieving our strategic priorities. Your elected board leadership team started the year off with a strategic planning session in partnership with National Park Service leaders. Together, we identified priority goals and objectives, as well as how to continue to enhance and build partnerships for continued success. The five priority goals identified were as follows: (1) increase attendance and enhance the visitor experience; (2) maintain the relevance of the Flight 93 story to a new generation; (3) assure continuing resources for sustainability of operations, projects, programs and personnel; (4) identify and prioritize fundable projects; (5) and identify partnerships and partnering opportunities to achieve the vision.

We successfully secured a five year funding source and hired a Learning Center Coordinator to assist with reaching audiences that we were unable to do with current resources. This position will not only assist in telling the story of Flight 93 to new generations, but will be integral in helping us raise funds to increase resources available for special educational projects. We have been awarded a capacity building matching grant from the National Park Foundation that will help us hire an Americorps VISTA volunteer. This resource will be significant in helping with the transition of the direct mail program from the National Park Foundation to the Friends. In the spring, the Friends assisted the National Park Service with executing the first Alternative Break Program for college students and have raised funds that will enable the National Park Service to offer two programs in 2019. Earlier this year, we transitioned our volunteer program from separate Friends and National Park Service volunteers to a collective Volunteers-in-Park Ambassador Program. This unifies the team of volunteers who work tirelessly to greet our visitors and enhance their experience through the interpretive stories of the lives of the 40 heroes we honor. As you review this annual report you will see examples of many other successes achieved through your membership and participation. My heart cannot express enough the gratitude I feel for each of our volunteers. Your unending commitment is beyond words, especially if you visit the memorial on a cold day and see the men and women in their winter coats greeting visitors with welcoming smiles. The undeniable commitment was most evident during the Tower of Voices Dedication when the monsoon rains were enough to dampen even the strongest spirit - but not our Ambassadors. They showed up and greeted guests with their own kind of sunshine. It truly takes a community to maintain the relevance of the Flight 93 story. Your membership and commitment support the daily actions of our rangers, park service leadership, Ambassadors, and our board leadership while programs, projects and personnel are positively impacted by your generosity. I speak for our entire community when I say thank you for your continued support of our mission and vision. I invite you to continue your membership because in my mind the best is yet to come. Thank you for entrusting me with the leadership of this organization. It is my greatest honor to serve you and the 40.

Through the work of the Friends, Flight 93 National Memorial will remain accessible, relevant and inspirational to present and future generations. Volunteer Support

Annual Visitation: 358,389

Members volunteer for annual event support including Plant a Tree, Walk 93, and the September 11 Observance. Unique to the Friends membership is *flag flying*. Our members help fly hundreds of United States flags at the memorial, generating funds for the National Park Foundation's Capital Campaign to complete all elements of the memorial design and revenue for the Friends organization.

The Friends contributed to 817 hours of service this year. Approximately 25 volunteers, including Friends members, scout groups, and ROTC organizations flew 945 U.S. flags over the memorial in 2018.

ANNUAL EVENTS



PLANT A TREE AT FLIGHT 93 – For the seventh year in a row, over 400 volunteers helped plant 14,960 native tree seedlings across 22 acres of memorial landscape. Thanks to this year's efforts, we have successfully planted 116,358 seedlings and raised nearly \$17,000 to support the planting initatives to take us one step closer to the goal of planting 150,000 seedlings.



WALK 93 – For the fourth consecutive year, the Friends of Flight 93, the National Park Service and Leadership Somerset County hosted Walk 93 to honor and remember the 40 passengers and crew members of Flight 93. This year's walk raised over \$20,000 to support a new picnic pavilion area to be constructed next year.



SEVENTEENTH OBSERVANCE – This year marked the end of the construction phase of the memorial with the final feature, the Tower of Voices, dedicated on September 9. The monumental tower stands 93 feet tall and will hold 40 wind chimes, symbolically representing the voices of the passengers and crew members. Nearly \$22,000 was raised to support the event which had 13,028 visitors over the four day weekend.



STEWARDSHIP



The Friends help the memorial remain accessible, relevant and inspirational to present and future generations. We use the power of volunteers and educational programming to better connect with communities beyond the memorial and invite new visitors to the park. It is our aim to develop life-long connections between the public and the memorial through varied educational and volunteer experiences.

In 2018, the Friends:

Registered over 400 volunteers to plant 14,960 tree seedlings during the seventh annual reforestation initiative and fiscally supported the first-ever Alternative Break Program. To date, a total of 116,358 trees have been planted, nearing the goal of 150,000 newly planted seedlings over 10 years. With the success of the Alternative Break Program, Flight 93 is now an official host site and member of Break Away, the national nonprofit that facilitates partnerships between universities and community partners.

Partnered for the fourth year with Leadership Somerset County to register over 160 participants for Walk 93, raising funds to support the construction of a picnic pavilion area at the memorial next year.

Raised \$1.2 million for the Tower of Voices construction in partnership with the National Park Foundation; hosted a reception for over 100 Family members after the Tower of Voices Dedication; organized 61 hospitality tent volunteers who contributed 35 hours of support from September 9-11 during the Seventeenth Observance of September 11, 2001.

Printed and distributed 60,000 rack cards on behalf of Flight 93 National Memorial.

Encouraged visitation among the nearly 400,000 public visitors through print and digital advertisements with the Laurel Highlands Visitors Bureau, Visit Pittsburgh, Pittsburgh Magazine, Allegheny Trail Alliance, and Leisure Group Travel Magazine.

Updated the Friends of Flight 93 website with homepage video integration, implemented a members' page and created a Founding Sponsor online registry to recognize over 150,000 individual donors who have supported the construction phase of Flight 93 National Memorial since 2005.

Produced a new orientation film with Wild Excellence Films that updated the oudated 2012 video for Flight 93 visitors, motor coach operators and school groups.

Invited Friends members for an exclusive hard-hat tour of the Tower of Voices for the mid-year meeting, and recognized volunteers during a joint Friends/NPS volunteer recognition event.

Worked with the National Park Foundation to support a direct mail campaign on behalf of Flight 93 National Memorial and supplied nearly 400 flags as gifts to donors.

ADVANCING EDUCATION



The Friends assist the National Park Service by embracing a larger role in education. Flight 93 National Memorial is a classroom and a place of learning; an educational institution to capture the interest of the public, students, volunteers, educational institutions and supporting partners.

In 2018, the Friends:

Assisted NPS with educational programming support through transportation grants to connect the story of Flight 93 to the next generation. Grants from Pirates Charities and the Pittsburgh Penguins Foundation supported transportation funding for over 5,227 students in regional school districts to take part in the National Park Service's curriculum-based educational programming developed for grade levels 4-12.

Continued to support the Junior Ranger Program in partnership with the joint Friends/NPS Education Committee by funding a re-design of the Junior Ranger Booklet to include Visitor Center activities which educated 1,805 families.

Supported the Children's Discovery Table which was presented 16 times throughout the year, connecting 4,726 children at the park with interactive learning opportunities.

Supported two special exhibitions at the memorial in partnership with Washington & Jefferson College and the Forbes Road Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution.

Promoted Learning Center programming in partnership with the National Park Service that included an FBI day with interactive children's activities, and promoted special ranger programming including a new walking tour, Latino Conservation Week, Veterans Day, and Memory to Memorials.

Implemented a Volunteer Spotlight to highlight the dedication and lives of the memorial's volunteers, and encourage stewardship and volunteerism among our followers.

Promoted bringing the PA Hardwood Council's Woodmobile to the memorial to emphasize the importance of trees and the living memorial landscape at Flight 93.

Took part in a volunteer trip to the Pentagon Memorial to foster partnerships among the three 9/11 sites, and exchange ideas and practices among the memorials' volunteer groups.

SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

Speaker Series

The second annual Speaker Series took place once a month from May to August and featured first responders, family members, local media and air traffic controllers.

The special programming connected 1,692 visitors to the stories of the aftermath of September 11, 2001, and the memorial's growth over the past 17 years. The summer-long series was presented by Somerset Trust Company, and all programs were free of charge to the general public.

Learning Center Exhibits and Programming

Down but not Out, a special exhibition presented in partnership with Washington & Jefferson College examined the longstanding relationship between baseball and the nation during times of national crisis, with a focus on baseball's role in recovery following the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001. This exhibit connected 4,093 visitors this summer.

NPS held a special weekend program with the FBI Investigation Response Team in the Learning Center, educating 349 visitors.

Ranger Programs at the Memorial Plaza offered over 530 formal interpretive programs that connected over 43,000 visitors to the lives of the passenger and crew members, and the story of Flight 93.

Additional interpretive programming was developed including a guided walk along the Allée, a special program highlighting Latino Conservation Week, special programs in the Learning Center on the US military's air response to the September 11 attacks, a new program Memory to Memorial's offering visitors in-depth learning on why we memorialize traumatic events, and a special design program facilitated by Ambssador Ron Reinbold provided additional interpretation to visitors.

Community Outreach

The Friends participated in programming in local communities, including presentations at Global Links, and group tour showcases at Heartland Travel Showcase and the Pennsylvania Bus Association, and partnered with NPS to bring the Children's Discovery Table to the Ligonier Country Market. The Friends would like to thank stewards Mal Fuller and Tom McMillan, who educated over 2,000 public attendees at various honorarium presentations throughout the year.

PRESERVING AMERICA'S SPECIAL PLACES



The Friends assist the National Park Service to protect and serve this National Memorial. We strive to cultivate excellence in stewardship of the memorial, and as a foundation for telling the story of Flight 93 so that it may remain relevant, accessible and inspirational to all who visit.

In 2018, the Friends:

Sustained two full-time staff members and hired a third staff member to work in partnership with the National Park Service to support Flight 93 National Memorial's educational programming and enhance the visitor experience. The new Learning Center Coordinator will be responsible for delivery of educational programming which achieves the mission of the Friends and is approved by the National Park Service, marketing the educational programs and the Learning Center, and preparing education related promotional materials.

Organized the second annual Speaker Series which featured first-person accounts from family members, first responders, local media and air traffic controllers connecting 1,692 visitors to the individuals connected to Flight 93.

Participated in a webinar with Interpretation Ranger Adam Shaffer for the Penn State Community Forestry Division for an educational session on Planting a National Memorial to further reforestastion and community outreach. The program was presented again at the Appalachian Regional Reforestation Initiative at Indiana University.

Assisted NPS with educating the public on the Tower of Voices construction through social media, a live webcam which has received over 500,000 views to date, and a live stream of the tower dedication and September 11 Observance.

Participated in two group tour showcases with other Laurel Highlands partners at Heartland Travel Showcase and the Pennsylvania Bus Assocation to educate group tour operators and leaders on features of the memorial.

Extended community outreach by bringing the park to local communities through the Discovery Table, community outreach programs through the Friends Speaker's Bureau and NPS off-site programs that connected 1,064 people to the story of Flight 93.

Supported the installation of honey bee homes and bluebird boxes in partnership with Powdermill Nature Reserve and Honey Smiles Summer thanks to a grant from the Nimick Forbesway Foundation; supported various environmental initiatives, including wetlands plantings and bird studies.
