Special Speaker Series Program will Highlight Ambassadors Role at Flight 93 National Memorial

SHANKSVILLE, PA – The Flight 93 Speaker Series continues this month with four special guests on July 27-28 as the memorial highlights the role of Ambassadors, otherwise known as Volunteers-in-Parks, who will share their unique stories on volunteering at the memorial, and their connections to Flight 93 National Memorial as Ambassadors.

During this installment of the Speaker Series, the guests will include the first wave of Ambassadors who helped develop the volunteer entity as it is known today, and delve into the stories about the site in the immediate aftermath of the crash of United Flight 93 on September 11, 2001. The presenters will showcase their backgrounds and stories of why they joined as volunteers after the terror events of 2001. These Ambassadors have a direct tie to the former temporary memorials; the volunteers will highlights pictures and stories from the chain-link fence temporary memorial to coincide with a special exhibit "Memories from the Memorial – Looking Back 2001 – 2011" on the temporary memorial days.

The exhibit, "Memories from the Memorial – Looking Back 2001 - 2011" will give the visitor a chance to connect with the Flight 93 Ambassadors, the volunteers who worked at the different temporary memorial locations to the present permanent memorial. These Ambassadors will be on hand to answer any questions visitors may have, and further explain the history the early temporary memorial features.

Three sessions, free and open to the public, will be held at noon and 2 p.m. on Saturday, July 27 and noon only on Sunday, July 28 in the memorial's Learning Center. One additional Flight 93 Speaker Series program will take place on August 17 (no Sunday program) and will feature Paul McNulty, president of Grove City College, who will discuss his experience as the lead prosecutor in the Zacarias Moussaoui trial and later his role as deputy attorney general under George W. Bush.
