MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Dear Friends, on behalf of Friends team members and the Board of Directors, I am writing to express our gratitude for your continued support and dedication to our mission to support Flight 93 National Memorial. As you have been watching the news, I am sure you will agree with us when we say, the parks need our help now more than ever.

Keeping the Flight 93 story meaningful and relevant for current and future generations continues to be one of Friends' key strategic priorities. In 2024, over 10,000 students in grades 4-12 experienced the memorial and learned the Flight 93 story. The virtual National Day of Learning "Teach to Remember 911" continues to attract over 22,000 students from forty-one states, Canada and the USVI. This virtual program earned the Excellence in Education Award from the Northeast Region of the National Park Service. Partnerships with the Gary Sinise Foundation, Project 9:57 and families offer leadership lessons from the Flight 93 story. With the recruitment of board members with education backgrounds, Friends look to continue enhancing current resources to keep up with educators' needs.

Environmental stewardship supports the living landscape at Flight 93 National Memorial. An Arbor Day of Caring in the spring helped the cultural resources team focus on the work needed in the Memorial Groves. Participants pruned, mulched, and removed dead and or dying trees throughout the forty groves. In conjunction with Arbor Day of Caring, Friends launched the Resiliency Project. This project is aimed at supporting the rehabilitation of the forty Memorial Groves over a period that could span more than 10 years. Friends committed to providing one million dollars over a 10-year period.

A Day of Caring provided environmental stewards with the opportunity to plant and protect trees from the wildlife population.

Visitation to the Memorial supports economic development in gateway communities surrounding Flight 93. The Somerset County tourism grant facilitates Friends advertising visitation to the memorial with billboards, digital and print ads in and around the metro DC and MD areas. The tourism funding helped Friends upgrade their website to be more user friendly and to help potential visitors plan their visit. Funding also provided Friends with the opportunity to partner and advertise in the three regional tourism organizations, Go Laurel Highlands, Bedford Visitor Bureau, and Visit Johnstown. All three organizations promote visitation to our region.

A significant milestone in 2024 was the transfer of funds from the National Park Foundation to Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial. There was \$2 million remaining in the Flight 93 Capital Campaign Fund that now makes up an endowment fund to be used for projects at Flight 93 National Memorial.

We invite you to join us in our upcoming events and initiatives. Your participation and input are invaluable to us. Together, we can continue to keep the Flight 93 story meaningful and relevant for current and future generations.

Thank you once again for your dedication and support. We look forward to working with you in the coming year to achieve even greater success.



The National Park Service and Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial hosted our second year of National Day of Learning "Teach to Remember 9/11", a virtual education program as part of the evolving 9/11 ceremony at Flight 93 National Memorial. Beginning June 2024, educators could register for the event.



THE LAUNCH OF THE RESILIENCY PROJECT


The Resiliency Project is a 10-year remediation plan for the 40 Memorial Groves. The National Park Service, the Olmsted Center for Landscape Preservation, Cornell University, Pennsylvania State University, State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry (SUNY-ESF) have created a plan based on five years of scientific studies of soil, irrigation and tree species to restore the resiliency of the 40 Memorial Groves for future generations.

Billboards, print ads, upgraded website and visitor guides from Go Laurel Highlands, and Bedford and Somerset counties.





Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial is a nonprofit organization engaged in raising funds through donations, grants and merchandise sales in order to support Flight 93 National Memorial with volunteers, resources and to support education, environmental intitatives and tourism.







VISITOR SPENDING IN 2023

In 2023, 378 thousand park visitors spent an estimated \$25.3 million in local gateway regions while visiting Flight 93 National Memorial. These expenditures supported a total of 360 jobs, \$13.5 million in labor income, \$21.0 million in value added, and \$37.2 million in economic output in local gateway economies surrounding Flight 93 National Memorial.


