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Flight 93 Family Member Lorne Lyles to Speak On June 16-17 at Flight 93 National Memorial

Shanksville, PA: Lorne Lyles, a Flight 93 family member who received a phone call from the hijacked plane on September 11, 2001, will be the featured guest at the Flight 93 Speaker Series on June 16-17 at Flight 93 National Memorial in Somerset County.

Lorne's wife, CeeCee Ross Lyles, was a flight attendant on Flight 93.

In the flight's final minutes, with hijackers in control of the plane, CeeCee called Lorne at their home in Florida to express her love, and inform him that passengers were mounting a counterattack and attempting to break into the cockpit.

The programs are scheduled for 12 pm and 2 pm on Saturday, June 16 and 1 pm on Sunday, June 17. They will be held at the memorial's Learning Center and are free to the public

Now in its second year, the Flight 93 Speaker Series is a joint effort of the National Park Service and the Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial. This is the second of four such events on weekends throughout the summer, presented by Somerset Trust.

Additional Flight 93 Speaker Series events are planned in July and August:

July 21, 22 – Tim Lambert, who owned land at the crash site, and Dennis Roddy, who covered the Flight 93 story for the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette, will give their unique perspectives on the event and its aftermath. Lambert and his family owned the hemlock trees that are such a prominent part of the memorial's story; he also is a Harrisburg-based radio reporter who reported from the site. Roddy wrote and helped to oversee much of the Post-Gazette's award-winning coverage.

August 18-19 – Cleveland-based air traffic controller John Werth, who monitored Flight 93 when it crossed into Ohio, and was the first person on the ground to realize that the flight had been hijacked, will be the featured speaker. He will be joined by Mal Fuller, who oversaw the air traffic control tower in nearby Pittsburgh. Fuller has been a board member of the Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial.
