**Flight 93 National Memorial Launches Second Year of Every Kid In A Park
*Receives Field Trip Grant from the National Park Foundation***

What: Superintendent Stephen M. Clark and Chief of Interpretation and Visitor Services MaryJane Hartman will be available for interviews on Thursday, October 20, 2016 at 8:45 a.m. at the Flight 93 National Memorial Learning Center. Representatives from the media are invited to come and learn about the new educational programs that are being offered at the Memorial as part of the National Park Service Every Kid in a Park program. The program gives fourth grade students, and those accompanying them, free access to more than 2,000 federally managed lands and waters. Members of the media will also be able to speak with teachers, parents and students from Windber Elementary who will be participating in educational programs on October 20 and 21 at Flight 93 National Memorial.
