Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial Speaker Series Begins May 19

Shanksville, PA: The popular Flight 93 Speaker Series is back for a second year starting this month. Free of charge to the public, the programs will focus on first-person stories and accounts of the events and aftermath of September 11, 2001.

The National Park Service and Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial are pleased to welcome Somerset County Coroner Wally Miller and Dennis Dirkmaat, chair of Applied Forensic Services at Mercyhurst University, in kicking off the summer-long Speaker Series on May 19-20 at Flight 93 National Memorial.

Dennis Dirkmaat is a forensic anthropologist who worked on site at Flight 93 National Memorial in September 2001. Wally Miller worked as the local coroner who oversaw the crash site and helped family members organize the "Families of Flight 93." In 2001, Dennis Dirkmaat served as the primary scientific advisor to Wally Miller during the recovery and identification of victims of United Flight 93.

Additional Speaker Series events will feature a variety of speakers and topics on specific weekends June, July and August:

June 16 & 17 - Family member Lorne Lyles, husband of Flight Attendant CeeCee Lyles, will relay personal stories.

July 21 & 22 - Tim Lambert, former landowner/local media and Dennis Roddy, writer for the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette who covered the events of September 11, 2001, and the Flight 93 story, will share the point of view from local residents.

August 18 & 19 - Air traffic controllers Mal Fuller and John Werth. Mal Fuller (Pittsburgh) and John Werth (Cleveland), will tell stories of being in their cities' air traffic control towers on September 11, 2001.

The Flight 93 Speaker Series is a joint effort between the National Park Service and Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial. The summer-long series is presented by Somerset Trust Company and will run one weekend a month from May to August. The presentations will take place on Saturdays at 12 pm and 2 pm, and Sundays at 1 pm in the Flight 93 National Memorial Learning Center.
