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## Emergency Preparedness



### Requirements:

2.b. Make a chart that demonstrates your understanding of each of the aspects of emergency preparedness in requirement 2a (prepare, respond, recover, prevent, and mitigate) about the situations listed below. (The following 5 situations count as the 5 options the scout may choose and all apply to Flight 93 National Memorial):

- (6) fire or explosion in a public place
- (9) flash flooding in town or in the country
- (10) mountain or back country accident
- (12) gas leak in a home or building
- (18) violence in a public place

5. With another person, show a good way to transport an injured person out of a remote and/or rugged area, conserving the energy of rescuers while ensuring the well-being and protection of the injured person.

7.a. Take part in an emergency service project, either a real one or a practice drill, with a Scouting unit or a community agency.

8.a. Tell the things a group of Scouts should be prepared to do, the training they would need, and the safety precautions they should take for the following emergency services.

- (1) crowd and traffic control
- (2) messenger service and communication
- (3) collection and distribution services
- (4) group feeding, shelter, and sanitation

9.c. Develop an accident prevention program for five family activities outside the home (such as taking a picnic or seeing a moving) that includes an analysis of possible hazards, a proposed plan to correct those hazards, and the reasons for the corrections you propose.
