





TRANSPORTATION FUNDING AVAILABLE FOR SCHOOLS TO VISIT FLIGHT 93 NATIONAL MEMORIAL THANKS TO PIRATES CHARITIES GRANT

SOMERSET, PA. – School districts from Pittsburgh, Allegheny County, Westmoreland County and Somerset County are encouraged to apply for transportation funding to visit Flight 93 National Memorial thanks to a generous education grant from Pirates Charities.

The Friends of Flight 93 National Memorial, the official nonprofit partner of Flight 93 National Memorial, received \$25,000 from Pirates Charities to support expanded educational programming at the memorial.

The curriculum-based programming launched last fall with two pilot programs based around the National Park Foundation's Every Kid in a Park initiative, which focused on fourth graders. Now in its second year, the current program implementation includes lesson plans geared towards fourth and fifth grade, sixth through eighth grade and grade levels nine through twelve, respectively.

The educational programs at Flight 93 National Memorial focus on the themes of action, honor and teamwork. Each program can be altered depending on time available. The on-site educational component includes an orientation and facilitated dialogue in the memorial's Learning Center where students are assigned a passenger or crew member to connect with. The class is then guided through the Visitor Center where the students are given the opportunity to learn about their assigned passenger or crew member, while learning about the story of Flight 93 and the actions of the forty passengers and crew members. To conclude the program, students walk along the 1.7-mile Allée down to the Memorial Plaza and Wall of Names to be immersed in the memorial landscape and themes of Flight 93, while taking part in recreational activities to promote healthy lifestyles and sustainability.

These programs utilize multimedia, exhibits, oral presentations and the memorial landscape to deliver a unique learning opportunity. The overall objective of these programs is to expose students to the various passengers and crew members of Flight 93: who they were, their names, what made them unique, and how do we remember them today at the memorial. There will also be special emphasis on the story of Flight 93, and the actions actions of the passengers and crew members.

The Flight 93 National Memorial Learning Center is a classroom where teachers, students, park rangers and volunteers identify and explore the story of Flight 93 and September 11, 2001. Upon arrival to the park teachers will bring their students to the Learning Center where they will review tribute items, watch a video, and be given a photographs/worksheets as part of an orientation of what will happen within the next two or four hours of their visit. Program lengths are adjustable depending on visitation time.
