 - a. The United States Capitol Building
4. Where did Flight 93 crash? (1:30)
 - a. Rural Pennsylvania

 - a. Toy airplane, hats, American flags, dog tags, notes, thank you letters

 - a. To memorialize human courage
8. How many people does the memorial honor? (3:38)
 - a. 40 extraordinary people
9. How does this video make you feel after watching it?
 - a. *Varies by students*

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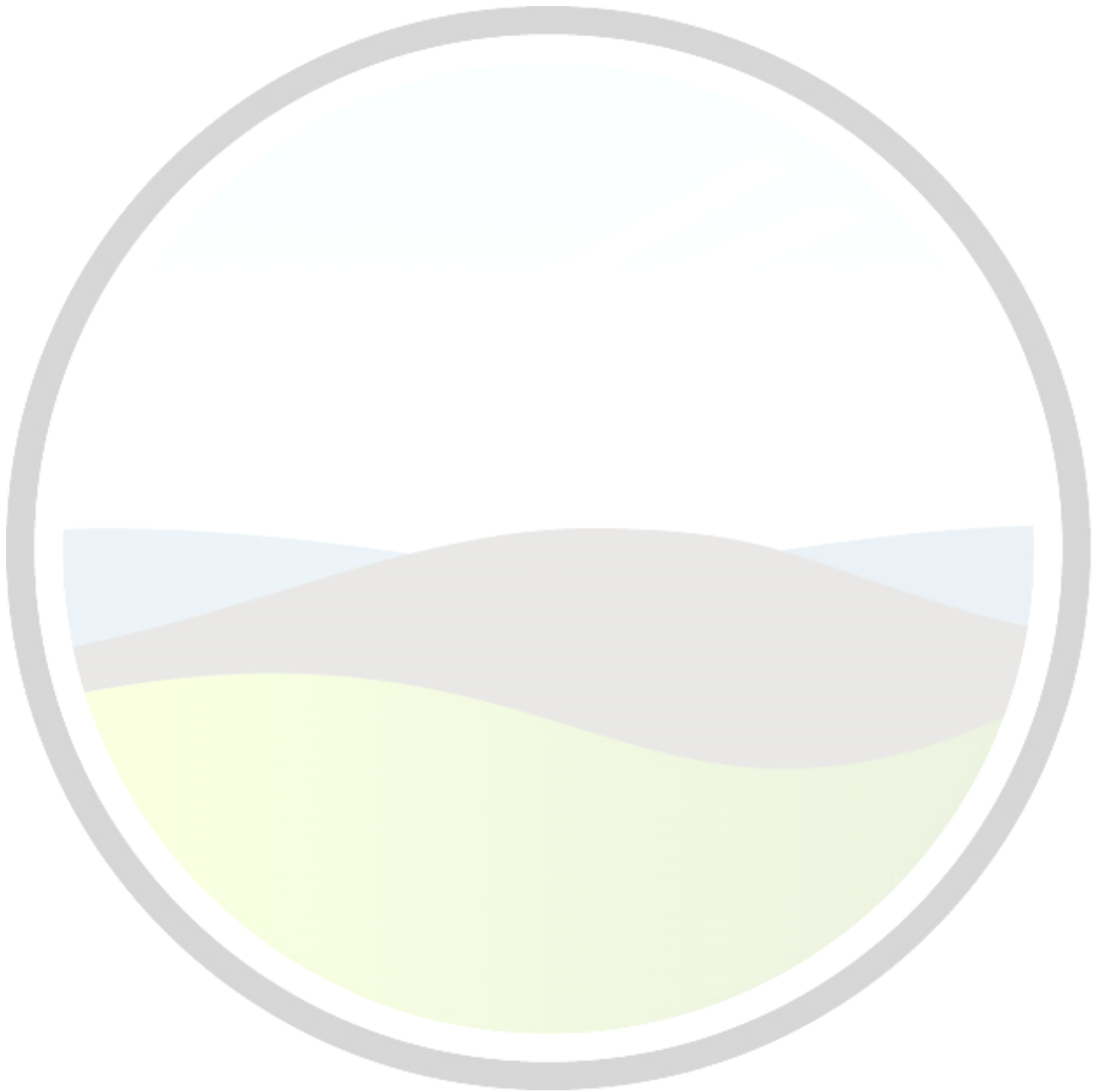
